Welcome to 2019!


The start of a new year... a time for resolutions to be made, and broken! At LRCP we actually feel like the year begins in September and by January all the children are settled and in routines both at the preschool and the school-age. Routine sounds like such a boring word but one thing we know for sure is that routine is important for children and routine with flexibility built into it is even more important. We strive to be consistent in our schedule so that both children and parents know what to expect at different times of the day, who children will be with and who to go to with questions. We also strive to make sure that all the staff and children are comfortable together so if someone is away all is good-children feel safe and secure regardless of which staff is with them. The flexibility we try to incorporate might look like giving children continue with an activity even though it is outdoor time, it might mean we have a large group time instead of small group times

when there is a visitor like Al Simmons, it might mean that staff trade off when working 1:1 with children, it might look like a whole bunch of things largely determined by the needs of the children at any given time. Routines are a part of the day and are the cogs that keep the wheels turning and usually are based on time commitments or regulations. Snacks and lunch are a certain time because children go to class, activities are broken up into groups because of regulations on group size, and going outside everyday is part of the day because of regulations and the very real need for fresh air and big muscle movement. The environment in our program is fluid and can look chaotic but there really is a structure in place and sometimes if you only see parts of it you may find it hard to believe!

On another note I would just like to make a mention that this January is year three of no increase to the operating budget of any licensed not-for-profit centre in Manitoba. This means that al-

though costs go up the centre's ability to provide quality programming and keep staff becomes more and more limited. We are not allowed to charge extra daily fees however the Province has now opened the door to charge for things like snack which we have never done. Coming soon from the Manitoba Child Care Association will be a petition that we hope to present for reading in the House that will call for an increase to funding- we will be looking of course, for signatures so please stay tuned for more information on this....we will need the families who use this service to join in this lobby before centres are in financial difficulties.
